New Electronic Truck Log Requirements now in effect. The new laws limit hours a driver can be on the road, causing deliveries from out of State; AZ, TX, WA to be up to 1 – 2 days late. This will likely affect transportation costs.

OVERVIEW & OUTLOOK

Asparagus: Both Peruvian and Mexican available. Prices beginning to adjust down. California grass expected in the next 4 to 6 weeks.

Avocados: All Mexican fruit. Prices adjusting to normal.

Bananas: Expect price hikes due to weather related / rain issues in the growing regions of Central and South America.

Bell Peppers: Pricing steady on all colors.

Berries: Strawberries supplies remain tight. They are available from Mexico and California/Oxnard area. **Berries:** Black and Raspberry – Supplies are steady from Mexico.

Berries: Blue – available from Mexico and South America.

Broccoli / Broccolini: Prices have adjusted downward.

Brussel Sprouts: Prices and supplies are steady.

Cauliflower: All colors are available. White is a great buy this week.

Citrus: Grapefruit – New Texas crop available.

Citrus: Lemons – California fruit and prices are steady. Meyers also available.
